What is ASD?

Autism, or autism spectrum disorder (ASD), refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication.

What does ASD Look Like?

Abnormal Tone of Voice.
Poor Eye Contact.
Behavioral Issues.
Stimming, or repetitive motion.
Speech Delay.
Difficulty Socializing.

Tips and Tricks to be Inclusive

Have a Fidget Basket with things they can touch.

Dim the lights or turn down the ambient music.

Offer something interactive instead of a tour, like a scavenger hunt.

Have comfy alternative seating for story time.

Train your staff to make these families feel welcome.

Open early and stay after hours.
